



Fiji Disability - Inclusive COVID-19 Response

What was happening



In May 2020 the **Pacific Disability Forum** helped the **Fiji Disabled Peoples Federation (FDPF)** ask persons with disabilities what they knew and understood about **COVID-19**.



Persons with disabilities were asked if **COVID-19** had affected their:

Work

Health

Education

Experience of gender-based violence



FDPF used the results to ask for interpreters and transcriptions for the deaf and hard of hearing during **COVID-19** national announcements.

Who made this happen?



Organizations of persons with disabilities like the **FDPF** work to make sure the rights and responsibilities of disabled people are recognized.



FDPF have been working since 1984 so persons with disabilities are treated fairly and asked about what matters to them.

What was done 2018 to 2022



They saw that persons with disabilities were not finding out about **COVID-19** services they could use.



They found out how much the Fiji Government was spending on **COVID-19**.



They found that the Government was not spending money so that persons with disabilities could get information about **COVID-19.**



So, they held public information meetings so more people could find out about staying safe.

Why is this important



It shows that everyone must be included if there are future emergencies. It is a good example of how organizations working together can change what governments do.

How did DRF and DRAF help?



In 2020 the **Disability Rights Fund** and **Disability Rights Advocacy Fund** gave money to help the **FDPF** ask persons with disabilities how the **COVID -19** pandemic affected them.
